


# **Island Rockhounds Show**



# A Discovery in the Workshop!

### **Birthstones**

Fun Fact: The birthstones for January, February, and March are garnet, amethyst, and either aquamarine or bloodstone for March.

Garnet has been used since the Bronze Age and the Egyptians used garnet in inlay work. Amethyst was once prized by royalty and held to be as precious as diamonds. Aquamarine has been linked to the sea for centuries due to his blueto-green color varieties.
