The Club would also like to thank Alice for writing up a new set of instructions for making cabochons, which will be distributed during the refresher.


Stained Glass Workshop

Maureen wrote up an account of her experience doing enameling at the club...

I practiced enameling recently, that was a lot of fun. I used the drill press to make the circles from 24g copper sheet, and Elaine helped me along the way. I sprayed hairspray and sifted enamel then fired the pieces in the kiln, leaving the edges raw. I learned about different textures achieved while firing, and how to speckle from sifting another color on top of the base layer. I made sterling silver ear wires to make the pieces into earrings and look forward to trying torch fired enameling soon.
