Places of Interest

One of our members, Sam, has found some interesting places to dig for fossils and garnets relatively close to home. He'll be organizing a trip sometime in the Spring. In the meantime, here's a bit about the places he's found...

1. Hudson River garnets near North Creek, NY. Garnets can be found in the stream bed. Nearby campsite with comfortable amenities about a 25 minute drive from the collecting site at the Eagle Point Campground. Equipment recommended: gem sieve or classifier, garden trowel, work gloves, screw driver or scraper for crevassing, kneeling pad or knee pads for comfort while working.

2. Big Brook Nature Preserve, Monmouth County, NJ. Late Cretaceous (Upper Campanian and lower Maastrichtian) fossils can be found sifting gravels in the stream bed. Equipment recommended: 1/4 inch mesh sieve or classifier, garden trowel (max six-inch blade length by law), water shoes, boots, or waders (I personally recommend water shoes, as they're easier to spend a day in than waders, and boots are annoying if they get flooded). Note that it is illegal to dig into the stream bank. Only dig loose gravel in the stream bed itself.

Below are some of the finds Sam has made at these sites. Great stuff!
